This sector comprises establishments primarily engaged in producing and distributing (except by wholesale and retail methods) information and cultural products. Establishments providing the means to transmit or distribute these products or providing access to equipment and expertise for processing data are also included. The unique characteristics of information and cultural products, and of the processes involved in their production and distribution, distinguish this sector from the goods-producing and servicesproducing sectors. Meanwhile, the recreation sector comprises establishments primarily engaged in operating facilities or providing services to meet the cultural, entertainment and recreational interests of their patrons.

Note: Active businesses are those businesses that reported having one or more employees in a given month. Opening businesses are businesses that transition from having no employees in the previous month to having at least one employee in the current month. These instances occur when a new, small firm begins, when a large firm opens a new establishment or when a seasonal firm re-opens. Continuing businesses are businesses that transition from having at least one employee in the previous month and at least one employee in the current month. Closing businesses are businesses that transition from having at least one employee in the previous month and at least one employee in the current month. Closing businesses are businesses that transition from having at least one employee in the previous month to having no employees in the current month. These instances occur when a small firm goes out of business, when a large firm closes an establishment temporarily or permanently, and when a seasonal firm ceases business activity for the year.







JOB POSTINGS BY SKILL TYPE




What education do occupations typically require?

JOB POSTINGS BY SKILL LEVEL




